Force for positive change:

This term, children will be learning about the importance of bravery. Maths

Children will learn to:

Place Value:

- Counting in multiples of 6, 7 and 9
- Decimals with money and using rounding to the nearest 10th and 100th



Addition and subtraction:

- Adding and subtracting numbers up to 4 digits using a formal method
- Using addition and subtraction to solve reasoning and multi-step worded problems

Multiplication and division:

- Factor pairs and commutativity ($9 \times 2 = 18$; $2 \times 9 = 18$)
- Formal method of short division

Geometry:

- Identifying acute and obtuse angles
- Comparing and ordering angles
- Position and direction: describe co-ordinates, plot points

English

Reading: In whole class reading, children, exploring a variety of text types designed to capture their interest and develop their comprehension ability.

Writing:

Flashback Narrative: Children will write a flashback narrative inspired by *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory* by Roald Dahl. Children will be using expanded noun phrases, conjunctions, fronted adverbials and direct speech.

Non-Chronological Report: Children will be writing a report about the factory in *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory*, warning people about the dangers and how to be safe. Children will be using grammatical and textual features and applying this within their own writing.

Music

This term, Children will be refining their singing and practicing the songs for Young Voices. Children will also be using the guitars and identifying the E, B and G string.



Computing

In Computing, we will develop digital literacy by collecting, logging, and analysing data. Pupils will use this information to answer questions, look carefully at results, and explain their findings using digital tools

PHSE: Dreams and Goals

Children will be learning about hopes and dreams, exploring how reflecting on happy experiences can help counteract disappointments. They will also discuss how setting personal goals and targets can help achieve their aspirations and how they can set new goals if things change.



Physical Education



PE – Outdoor –Golf

Students learn how to strike a ball using a Launcher (wedge), focusing on sending it as far as possible. They practice combining striking skills with both Rollers and Launchers to improve distance, accuracy, and game play. These skills are then applied in simple competitions, using 1v1 and 2v2 situations to beat an opponent

PE- Swimming

This will take place every week on Tuesday at Albany Leisure Centre Enfield.

Spanish



This term, the children will be describing classroom items. Children will also be practicing singular and plural forms. Children will look at school items and subjects and learn how to express their opinions about them.

D&T: Textiles

In D&T, children will explore tunics, learning about their history and when they were first worn. They will take inspiration from existing designs, practise sewing techniques, plan their own tunic designs, and create their garments. Finally, they will evaluate their finished products, considering what worked well and what could be improved.



Geography

Recap different places and locations around the world, identifying countries and their flags. They will also work on improving their knowledge of geography by locating countries on a map.

History: Anglo- Saxons and Vikings

In History, children will learn about the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings, exploring their invasions of Britain and the reasons behind it. They will investigate the chronology of these events and examine artefacts to understand the way of life during this time. Additionally, they will explore the lasting impact of the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings on today's world.

Science: States of Matter

This term children will be learning about states of matter.

This term, children will compare and group materials into solids, liquids, and gases, observing how some change state when heated or cooled. They will identify evaporation and condensation within the water cycle and explore how to classify animals in Antarctica. By recapping prior knowledge on living organisms and habitats, children will examine the impacts of changing environments on living things and conclude with an explanation text about the water cycle.
